Due to Environment degradation the earth which we call as "Mother" is now sick with so much of pesticides and wastes. Global warming is one of the greatest problems to be addressed today



Introduction

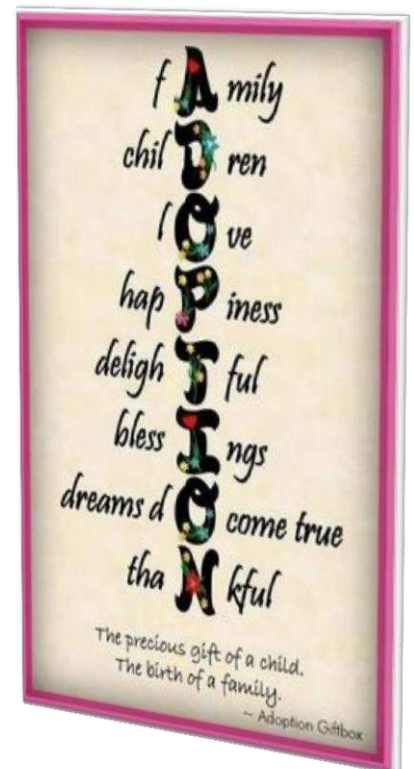
Adoption is the establishment of a parent-child relationship through a legal and social process other than the birth process. It is a process by which a child of one set of parents becomes the child of another set of parents or parent. It is a way of providing new families for children who cannot be raised by their biological parents. In this legal procedure, all parental responsibility is transferred to the adopters.

Adoption involves the founding of the parent – child relationship between individuals who are not related by blood. The adoptive family gives the adopted child all the rights, privileges, heir and other duties similar to a child of the biological parents.

AIM: To provide secure and stable adoptive families that will provide opportunities and space for children to grow, develop and realize their innate potentials.

OBJECTIVE:

- ✓ To provide every child a permanent family through adoption by which every child’s individual need will be satisfied.
- ✓ To provide excellent care, medical help and affection for abandoned children.
- ✓ To promote child adoption in India, with focus on domestic adoptions.
- ✓ To ensure that every child gets a home and is never left alone.
- ✓ To enable a database of the Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAP’s).
- ✓ To assist the PAPs in the process of adoption, especially with regard to adoption procedures and pre – adoption counseling.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ADOPTION AND FOSTER CARE

Adoption:

Adoption is a legal process by which a child becomes a full member of a new family, with the adoptive parents assuming all parental responsibilities.

Foster Care

Foster care is a temporary arrangement where a child lives with a family until circumstances enable the child to return to their own family, to live independently or to be placed for adoption.

MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CHILDREN

Every child at SOC SEAD is given the best possible medical care until he/she is given for adoption. Children at SOC SEAD are given timely immunizations and vaccines and care is taken to maintain an individual medical record. At SOC SEAD children are given valuable medical assistance from well-known pediatricians and child psychologists.

ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT

- ✓ Care takers in SOC SEAD take good care of the children in the home.
- ✓ Social Workers perform systematic and accurate home study.
- ✓ SOC SEAD ensures regular uploading of data, home study, Child Study Report (CSR), Medical Examination Report (MER) and follow – up of children in CARINGS as per the new Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) guidelines.
- ✓ Totally 68 home studies have been completed during this financial year (April 2015 – March 2016).
- ✓ 74 wait listed parents are awaiting their bundle of joy

CONCLUSION

Children are an important national asset and they have every right to enjoy their privilege as a citizen of this nation. Keeping this in mind, SOC SEAD makes it possible for every child to grow in a secured and caring ambience because “*Every child has a right to love, to be loved*”. CHILDLINE – 1098



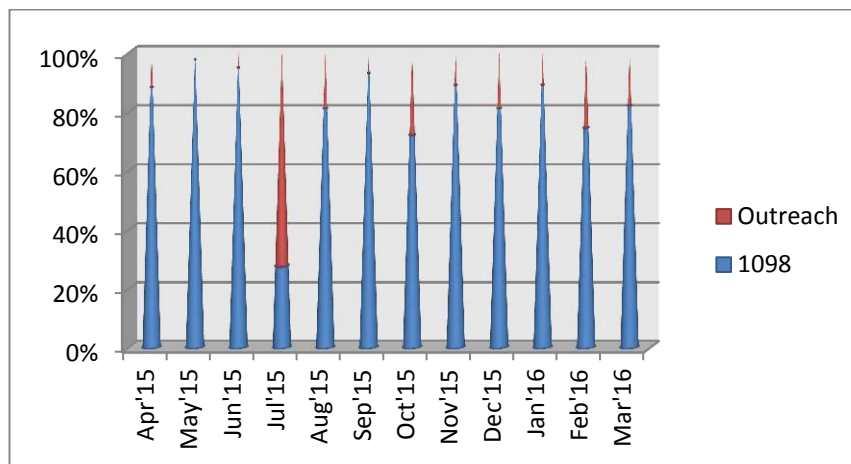
*National 24 hour Free Emergency Telephone Outreach Service
for Children in need of Care and Protection*
(Project by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India)

INTRODUCTION:

CHILDLINE is the most widespread children’s phone emergency outreach service. It is a unique accessible service offered to children to contact for any help. CHILDLINE Trichy has been functioning successfully from 2001 and has successfully reached out to the most needed and unreached children. The detailed report from April 2015 to March 2016 is given below.

INTERVENTION CALLS TO 1098

Intervention involves reaching out to children in crisis providing emergency assistance and linking them to services available for long-term care. In **CHILDLINE** during the period of April 2015 – March 2016, 730 **were** recorded as intervention calls.



OUTREACH AWARENESS

Regular outreach awareness programs have been conducted in railway stations with the support of railway police. This year **187** awareness programs were organised and **7952** children benefitted from such programs.

POLICE PERSONNEL AWARENESS

Police personnel play an important role in safeguarding the rights and interest of the public. As they have direct contact with the people, it becomes essential to create awareness about CHILDLINE among the police personnel too. Keeping this in mind, Railway Protection Force, Railway Police, City Police Personnel and Home Guard were given **64** awareness programs on the role of CHILDLINE and around **975** police personnel including trainees benefited through such programs.

AUTO DRIVERS AWARENESS

Auto drivers have more access to the public than others and so it becomes necessary to make them aware on the role of CHILDLINE and the free emergency services provided by 1098, so that they can help the children in distress. This year **65** awareness programs have been organised and around **890** auto drivers were happy to learn about the importance and services of CHILDLINE.

SCHOOL AWARENESS:



CHILDLINE was able to reach 20,186 school children from 116 Schools (14 Higher Secondary, 14 High School, 28 Middle and 60 Primary School) in Manapparai, Marungapuri and Vaiyampatti areas. Through such school awareness, children came to know about their own rights; and if denied, the ways and means through which they can safeguard their rights when they approach CHILDLINE.

FESTIVAL AWARENESS

During festivals, CHILDLINE has never ceased any opportunity to create awareness in temples, churches, mosques and shopping centers where people gather in great numbers. At such places, it is essential to make the people know about the services rendered by 1098 in order to protect the interest of children. Around 15,000 people

including children benefited through such awareness programs conducted at public places.



PCO AWARENESS:

PCOs are the main source of transmitting information about the children in distress and so, it becomes necessary to create awareness among the PCO owners about the services rendered by 1098. This year **54** awareness programs were organised and accordingly **1265 (847 Male, 418 Female)** benefited from the programs.

SELF HELP GROUP:

The awareness program on CHILDLINE 1098 was conducted for **37** Women Self-help Groups. This time the message was conveyed through songs, skit and other cultural programs, which were performed by the members of the team.

The program was useful as about **5000** women benefited and came to know about CHILDLINE 1098.

Operation Muskaan:

Trichy City and Trichy Rural – “Operation Muskaan”, a special campaign to trace the missing children was initiated between 01.07.2015 and 31.07. 2015. After successful implementation of ‘Operation Smile’, the railway police started implementing ‘Operation Muskaan’ – another successful mission to trace the missing and destitute children and have successfully reunited many children with their parents. The main aim of this program was to prevent child trafficking and rescue children from persons who tried to push the children in begging, sexual trade and other antisocial activities.

Awareness on Independence Day

Every year CHIDLINE 1098 team makes it a point to create awareness on the activities carried out by CHIDLINE 1098 on Independence Day. This year also the team carried out its duty at various places of Trichy district and was able to reach about 10,000 people.



Community Awareness Program

The Anti Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU), Trichy city organized an awareness program at Varaganeri on 20.06.2015 regarding child rights. Around 600 people participated and benefited in this awareness program.

CHIDLINE Stall Awareness Program: CHIDLINE 1098 displayed CHIDLINE awareness stall at Manachanallur, No.1 Tollgate, Samayapuram, Manapparai, Ariyamangalam and Puthur during the month of Sept.2015. Members used megaphone and it proved to be a great way to create awareness on issues related to child rights, child marriage, child labour and sexual abuse.

Mobile Awareness Program

Mobile Awareness Program is an important activity of CHILDLINE1098. This year the mobile awareness program was conducted in Somarasampet, Maruthandakuruchi, Seerathoppu, Yegirimangalam, Perur, Kulumani, Koppu, Ayilapettai, Ettarai, Othakadai, Posampatti, Viyalanmedu, Pothayur, Keerikalmedu, Thayanur, Pallakadu, Allithurai and the public were able to learn about issues such as child marriages, child labour, child rights and sexual abuse.



CHILDLINE Desk: CHILDLINE 1098 regularly checks for missing children at railway junction and central bus stand taking help from RPF personnel. It also makes a note of runaway cases, if any.

“KOMAL” - Teaching through Short Film



The school children were given awareness on *Safe and Unsafe Touch* through the short film “Komal”. Also, videos on preventing child marriages were displayed at Manapparai, Vaiyampatti and Maungapuri Block schools. About 20,186 children benefitted through this program.

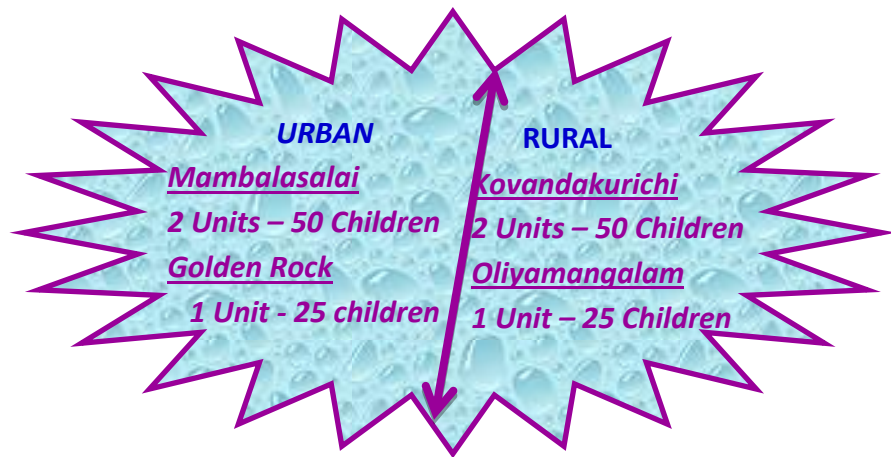

With increasing employment opportunities for women and growing need to supplement household income, more and more women are entering into the job market. With the breaking up of joint family system and the increasing number of nuclear families, working women need support in terms of quality, substitute care for their young children while they are at work.

In order to help such women, creches are made available. Creches are a boon to these children where they enjoy playing and learning. At creches, children are provided nutritious meal in the afternoon, good snacks and milk in the morning and evening, immunization and health care facilities and regular medical checkup. There are trained teachers to take care of children.

Joining hands with Catholic Health Association of India and Liliane Fonds, Netherlands, SOC SEAD is on a mission to provide rehabilitation for children with disabilities. This program envisages identifying disabled individuals and assists them to find various rehabilitation facilities.

55 children with special needs of various categories such as Physically challenged, Hearing Impaired, Visual Impaired, Mentally retarded and cerebral palsy in the slums; namely, Natharsa Palli Vassal, Valluvar nagar, Andakondan, Srirangam and Singarathope were given home based training.

The main aim of SOC SEAD is to give access to health, education, livelihood and social interventions to both disabled children and youngsters together with the support of the Catholic Health Association of India and Liliane Foundation.

- To provide much needed services to children with disabilities
- To encourage parental involvement and understanding of special education programs
- To teach self-acceptance, self-respect, dignity and freedom to special children

“PIECES TO PEACE”

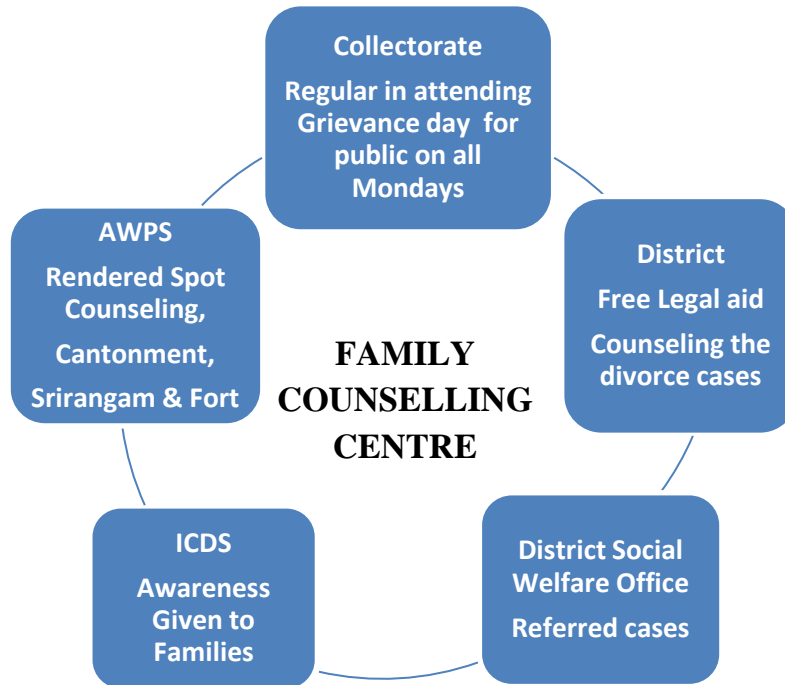

Alcoholism or alcohol dependence is defined by the American Medical Association (AMA) as “a primary, chronic disease with genetic, psycho social and environmental factors influencing its development and manifestations”.

Alcohol affects the entire body system, causing a wide range of health problems. Problems include poor nutrition, memory disorder, difficulty with balance and walking, liver disease (including cirrhosis and hepatitis), high blood pressure, muscle weakness (including the heart), heart rhythm disturbances, anemia, clotting disorders, decreased immunity to infections, gastro intestinal inflammation and irritation, acute and chronic problems with the pancreas, low blood sugar, high blood fat content, interference with reproductive fertility, increased risk of cancer of the liver, oesophagus, weakened bones, sleep disturbances, anxiety, chest depression. About 20% of adults admitted to the hospital (for any reason) are alcohol dependent. Men are more than twice as likely to be alcohol dependent than women, and smokers who are alcohol dependent are much more likely to develop serious or fatal health problems associated with alcoholism.

Alcoholism is becoming a widespread problem in the Indian society and Tamil Nadu is no exception. The age of first exposure to alcohol in the state has dropped to 15 years. Added concern is the increasing numbers of women, especially girls becoming addicted to alcohol. This trend is causing socio-economic problems but little is being done to arrest this social trend.

SOC SEAD Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts makes professional intervention in the lives of alcohol addicts for better change. The center has completed 16 years of service during which 3811 alcoholics and drug addicts were treated. During the last financial year of 2015-2016, totally 274 alcohols / drug addicts were treated.
