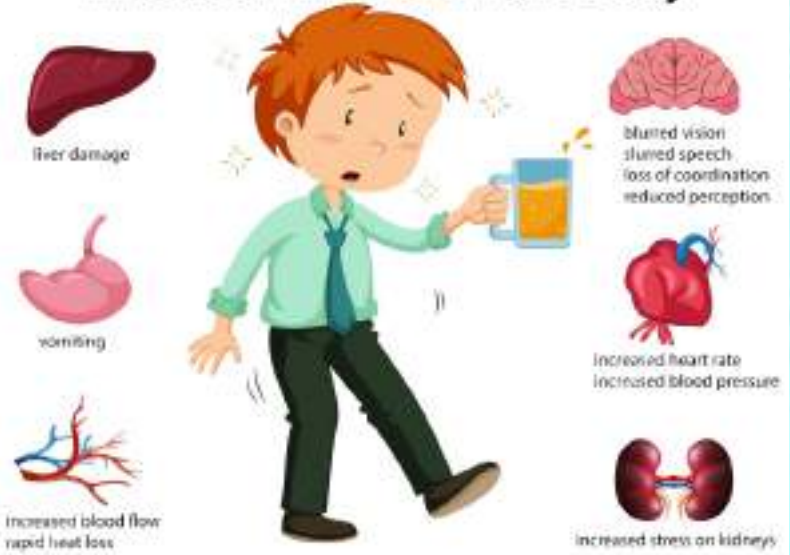

## Drug Abuse and Addiction

Impact on the Brain, Risk Factors, and Warning Signs

Alcoholism in India has significant negative impacts on individuals, families, and society as a whole, including health issues, economic burdens, and social problems. It contributes to preventable deaths, disability, and a decline in overall well-being. Additionally, alcohol consumption is linked to increased crime rates, legal costs, and strained family relationships.

### Effects of Alcohol on the Body



SOC-SEAD, through the Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts makes professional intervention in the lives of addicts for better change. The centre has completed 24 years of service and 6305 alcoholics and drug addicts were treated. During the last financial year 01.04.2024 to 31.03.2025, 287 alcoholic / drug addicts were treated.

I was placed as a fieldwork trainee in the Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts, SOC-SEAD, Trichy from 05.12.2024 to 13.03.2025. I understand the process in IRCA program. I learnt how to give awareness program to the community, motivation to the clients, individual counselling, family counseling, group therapy, relaxation therapy, and Re-educative lectures, case work study etc to the patients. This centre gives extraordinary services to make drug and alcohol-free society. The staff of this centre is well experienced and dedicated to their services. I am confident that I will do my best in services to the needy people from my experiences.

### **Success Story of the Recovered Client:**

I am Mr. Murugadass, Age 45 , living in Trichy. I was addicted to alcohol for the past 23 years. Initially, I started to consume alcohol occasionally but after that, I consumed alcohol regularly in the evening. After a few months, I started to consumed every day in the early morning. It affected my physical and mental health, and also affects my occupation and created problems in my family. One of my friends



suggested and referred me to take treatment in SOC-SEAD, IRCA. I am directly contacted with Mr. S. Diaz, project Co-ordinator of IRCA, he consulted me and explained me about the treatment procedure, and I was finally admitted to the centre for treatment. I was stayed in the centre for one month. The staff provides re-educative classes, individual counselling, family counselling, group therapy, relaxation therapy and yoga therapy for my betterment. This treatment made me aware of my addiction problems and led to a change in my attitude towards recovering from alcohol. Now I entered into a new life, fully engaged in my family and occupation. The SOC-SED, IRCA, gave enlightenment in my life journey without alcohol. Once again, I thank all the staff of IRCA.

# Family Counselling Centre

(Aided by Widow & Destitute Women Welfare Board, New Delhi & Chennai)

**“Love and protection will improve family relationship”.**

## Introduction:

The scheme of Family Counselling Centre was introduced by CSWB in 1987. At present the Scheme is functioning under the umbrella of “Welfare of Widow & Destitute Women Welfare Board”. The Family Counselling Centre provides counselling, referral and rehabilitative services to women and children who are victims of atrocities, family maladjustments and social ostracism and also provides crisis intervention and trauma counselling in case of natural disasters. The Centres also creates awareness and mobilizes public opinion on social issues affecting status of women. The FCC works in close collaboration with the local administration, police, courts, free legal aid cell, medical and psychiatric institutions, vocational training centres etc.

This centre functions effectively as per the guidelines of Central Social Welfare Board. The people, who approach the centre share their feelings, understand problems and feel better through professional counselling intervention, thus bringing peace and harmony to the individual, families and couples.

## Objectives:

- i) To provide professional services like crisis intervention, independent inquiry in dowry death cases and counselling in family maladjustment.
- ii) To make efforts for reconciliation in the cases of separation and out of court settlement in marital cases.
- iii) To provide referral services like SwadharGrih, free legal aid, police assistance etc.
- iv) To make the counselling services available in SwadharGrih, remand homes, orphanages, de-addiction centres, old age homes, shelter homes, prisons, schools for children etc.
- v) To educate and mobilize public opinion against social problems.
- vi) To educate and impart information regarding social welfare activities undertaken by various governmental and non-governmental agencies for better coordination and services to the people.
- vii) To arrange for suitable rehabilitation services for the victims and their dependents.
- viii) To provide crisis intervention services to the needy.

Effective day care for young children is essential and a cost effective investment as it provides support to both the mothers and young children. SOC SEAD runs 6 creches to augment the overall growth and development of 150 children in both rural and urban areas.

SOC SEAD implements the programme with the aid of Central Social Welfare Board, Government of India, and New Delhi. 5 units are functioning in Trichy Districts and 1 unit in Pudukkottai District.

## Objectives:

- ❖ The children are supplied with supplementary nutrition for better health.
- ❖ The Children are taught through the play way method.
- ❖ Quarterly medical checkups are organized for the children.
- ❖ The children are supplied with supplementary nutrition for better health.
- ❖ 150 children from the age group of 6 months to 6 years are benefitted through this project.
- ❖ Each crèche is managed by a crèche worker and a helper.
- ❖ Expression of thoughts and ideas through speaking and drawing
- ❖ Regular parent-teachers meetings are held for better learning and development of children.
- ❖ Physical development of children usually includes simple and easy exercises and outdoor games to ensure the physical fitness of the children.
